## Principal's Message



### LIFE ISN'T ALWAYS FAIR

**Students can be crushed by self-blame when they study or train hard and don't come out on top.**

Some students have bought into a false promise that they can achieve anything if they work for it. Emphasising the importance of a growth mind set and complimenting young people on effort (versus innate ability) may be good for many young people but it's not good for everyone. The humbling reality is that you can do everything in your power and still fail. For some young people, life has taught them that this is true, and it serves as a base on which to build confidence through affirmation and continuous effort. But for others, the belief that success is always within their grasp is a problem, especially when kids feel that losing is a disaster, that how they perform for others is more important than what actually inspires them.

Of course kids should be taught to work hard and be resilient. But fantasising that they can control everything is not really resilience. We would be wise to remind our kids that life has a way of sucker-punching us when we least expect it. It's often the people who learn to say 'stuff happens' who get up the fastest.

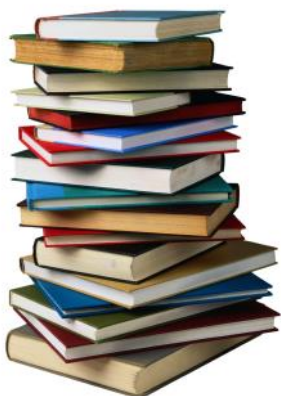
